you are sure to be hung, and you had better prepare for another world." I said it is thought that one man could not murder three persons in so short a time. I understand by the paners that the police are aft r two persons. Reid then said. "There were no others in it." I then said, "It is reported that you had a quarrel with the servant, and were heard to may that you would be revenged on her, or serve her out." He said then, with a strong emphasis. It is all lies, I never had a quarrel with her." I communicated Reid's Statements to Mr. Hazue, one of the visiting magistrates.

Cross-examined by Mr. Seynour.—I never said a syllable to Reid about the manner in which he was to plead on his trial. I never said to Reid that the doctors thought hanging was an easy death. It is one of the rules in York Castle, not to allow prisoners to speak whilst they are at their mess. Reid never said, "there are only us two in for it." He said, "there were no others in it."

Thomas Green was then re-called, and stated that after the murder in question, the front door was found to be locked.
