

DEWSBURY UNION.—MIRFIELD PARISH.—The Board of Guardians of the Poor of the Dewsbury Union intend, on *Wednesday, the Twenty-seventh of August, 1851*, to APPOINT an ASSISTANT OVERSEER of the Poor of and Collector of Poor rates for the Parish of Mirfield, in the said Union, in the room of Mr. William Oates, resigned, at the salary of £35 per annum. The person appointed to the office will have to make and collect all rates for the relief of the poor, &c., and to assist the Overseers of the Poor of the said parish in the performance of the duties of their office, and he will be required to commence his duties on the *Twenty-ninth day of September next*. The person appointed to the office will be required to give bond, with two or more sufficient sureties, to the amount of £450, for the faithful discharge of his duties. Every person who intends being a candidate must send sealed testimonials as to character and ability (which must be in the form of a separate letter or certificate from each recommending party, and not in one general certificate) to the Board-room, Church-street, Dewsbury, before ten o'clock on the *Twenty-seventh of August instant*, for the inspection of the Board of Guardians. The appointment will be made at twelve o'clock at noon precisely, and the candidates must attend personally at that time.
