

HAWKING WHISKY.—On Monday last, at the Court-house, before J. B. Greenwood and F. Wormald, Esqrs., Patrick Lydon and Thos. Cane were charged by Mr. Williams, one of the officers of Inland Revenue, with hawking whisky at Mirfield on the 2nd October. On the day named the two prisoners were apprehended near to the Three Nuns, by Haworth and Tattersall, two of the Mirfield constables, each of the prisoners having a quantity of whisky in his possession. They were conveyed to the lock-up at Dewsbury, and the officers then went to Paddock, near Huddersfield, and in the house of Thos. Lister found a still and a quantity of spirits and wash, which they removed. Cane, on being brought before the Justices, was discharged, and Lydon convicted in the penalty of £100, and in default of payment committed for three months to hard labour.
