No person can be appointed a medical officer unless he is duly qualified, as required by the Poor Law Commissioners General Consolidated Order of 24th July, 1847. The persons appointed will be entitled to certain extra fees, the particulars of which and also the duties of the office, and the boundaries of the districts, may be known on application to the Clerk of the Guardians. And each person appointed will be required to enter into a contract for the vaccination of persons resident in his district at the sum of one shilling and sixpence for every person successfully vaccinated. Such medical gentlemen as intend being candidates, and have not heretofore produced to the Board of Guardians evidence of qualification, must send or deliver (free of expense) sufficient evidence of qualification and such testimonials as they may deem necessary, to the Board Room, Union Workhouse, Dewsbury, before ten o'clock on Wednesday, 19th March inst., for the inspection of the Guardians. The appointments will be made on the 19th March inst., at twelve o'clock at noon, and the candidates will be pleased to attend personally.—By order,
