DEFRAUDING A RAILWAY COMPANY.—Thomas Schotield, boot and shoe maker, of Mirfield, was summoned before the magistrates, at the Huddersfield Court-house, yesterday, for attempting to defrand the Lundon and North-Western Railway Company. On the 24th March the defendant procured a ticket for Bradley from Huddersfield, and instead of getting out at the proper station he rode forward to Mirfield, and was seen by the ticketcollector to get out of the wrong side of the carriage. He was asked for his ticket, and produced the ticket for Bradley. He was asked for the extra fare, but did not pay it. The defendant pleaded guilty. The railway company pressed for a penalty, and the defendant was fined 2s. 6d. and costs—total 17s.
