

INQUESTS BEFORE MR. T. TAYLOR.—Yesterday, Mr. T. Taylor, of Wakefield, held an inquest at Mr. W. Beaumont's, the Shoulder of Mutton Inn, Mirfield, on the body of a female named Ann Jubb. The deceased was seventy-seven years of age, and a widow. She resided with one of her sons, at Lee Green, Mirfield. On the 12th ult. she was knocked down by a train, and received such serious injuries that she died on Saturday. The jury returned a verdict of "Accidentally knocked down."—On Monday Mr. Taylor held an inquest at Mr. E. Gilyard's, the Black Horse Inn, Wakefield, on the body of a prisoner named William Edmonds. The deceased, who was twenty-one years old, and a plasterer, arrived at the Wakefield Prison from Cold Bath-fields on the 2nd of September last, having been sentenced at the Middlesex sessions, in April, to two years' imprisonment, for stealing a horse and cart. He appeared in good health, and worked in his cell as a mat finisher up to the 30th of March, when he was placed on the sick list for a slight attack of bronchitis. He was treated in his cell until the 10th of April, when he was removed to the hospital, where he died on Sunday afternoon; the cause of death, in the opinion of Mr. Milner, the resident surgeon, being exhaustion from phthisis. The jury returned a verdict of "Died from natural causes."
