WORK AND WAGES.

STRIKE OF WEAVERS AT RAVENSTHORPE.—A strike of the weavers employed by Messrs. Day, Nephew, and Son, woolien manufacturers, Ravensthorpe, took place on Friday, in consequence of one of them having been discharged by her employers for having damaged her work. They sought an interview with Mr. George Day on Saturday, but as he was not at the works on that day, they could not see him until Tuesday morning, when they were told to go again yesterday. In the meantime the engine was stopped, and all the hands were temporarily thrown out of employment. A satisfactory arrangement has been come to, and work will be resumed this morning.
