

FOUNDATION OF A MORAVIAN SUNDAY SCHOOL AT MIRFIELD.—Mr. Arthur Anderton, of Cleckheaton, on Saturday last laid the corner-stone of a new Moravian Sunday school at Wellhouse, Mirfield, which is to replace one erected in 1827 through the efforts of the Rev. David Craig, and which has from time to time been altered and enlarged, but has now become quite inadequate to the requirements. The Rev. W. Taylor, Bishop of the Moravian Church, and president of the board of directors, of London, opened the proceedings with prayer. Mr. J. F. Crowther introduced Mr. Anderton. Mr. T. Laug deposited a bottle containing various documents and coins under the stone. Mrs. G. Armitage presented a trowel to Mr. Anderton, and a mallet was presented to him by Mr. J. J. Oates. Mr. Anderton then laid the stone, and gave a short address. At the close of the ceremony a public lovefeast was held in the chapel, which was presided over by the Rev. W. Taylor; and addresses bearing chiefly on Sunday school work were delivered by the Chairman, Mr. Anderton, the Rev. J. Baxter, and the Rev. E. R. Hassé.—Mr. J. J. Oates read a brief history of the Moravian cause at Wellhouse.
