

**CAB-DRIVERS AND THEIR FARES.**—Yesterday, at the Dewsbury West Riding Court, a Mirfield cab-driver, named George Lister, was summoned for refusing to convey a person to her destination within the Mirfield Urban Sanitary District.—The defendant said he had a *bonâ fide* engagement, and if it had only been a journey of some ten minutes he would have taken the girl, but he could not have been back in time.—Mr. E. T. Ingham, Justice of the Peace, said he was the person who had engaged the defendant for ten o'clock, and he was of opinion that on such a night it would have taken him three-quarters of an hour to go to Hopton Hall and back.—The Bench dismissed the case, but told defendant that cab-drivers could not pick and choose fares.
